ABA Model Rule 6.1

ABA Model Rule 6.1 establishes a professional responsibility for all attorneys to provide pro bono service

Voluntary Pro Bono Publico Service:

Every lawyer has a professional responsibility to provide legal services to those unable to pay. A lawyer should aspire to render **at least (50) hours** of pro bono publico legal services per year...

Ohio Supreme Court Statement on the Provision of Pro Bono Services

"This Court strongly encourages each Ohio lawyer to ensure access to justice for all Ohioans by participating in pro bono activities."

PBPO staff attorneys prescreen and coordinate every project



- Equipment lease agreements
- Release/waiver forms
- Special events contracts
- Contracts to retain a consultant
- Shared services agreements



Sample Employment Law Projects

- Immediate employee issues (e.g., potential termination)
- Employment manuals or personnel policies
- Properly categorizing workers as independent contractors vs. employees
- Properly categorizing employees as exempt vs. nonexempt
- Issues such as maternity leave, disability, staff restructuring
- COVID-19 questions (lots of these!)



Sample IP & Website Projects

- Trademark registration of name and logo
- Terms of Use and Privacy Policy
- Protecting ownership of curriculum materials
- Drafting Media Release

Added Value:


Many projects are eligible for Ohio CLE credit


